## Upholding Justice and Public Safety

Criminal justice graduates are in high demand to serve in a variety of roles in criminal justice agencies and related sectors, from policing and corrections to courts and juvenile justice. UCF offers a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice designed to provide students with a comprehensive exposure to crime response and its impact on society through a multidisciplinary lens.

## Choose your Path

Two degree tracks are available to choose from based on students' professional aspirations.

The **Professional Track** culminates in state certification and a criminal justice management and leadership certificate, streamlining the college-to-career path by embedding the police or correctional academy into a required internship. As a result, graduates gain a competitive edge for future advancement opportunities.

The **Scholars Track** caters to students who plan to pursue UCF's criminal justice graduate program, incorporating upper-level courses in their program of study and the opportunity to work closely with criminal justice professors on research.

## Curriculum

Courses in the bachelor's in criminal justice program are available both face-to-face and online. Students can tailor their program of study to their individual goals through a variety of elective courses and experiential learning opportunities, from internships and study-abroad programs to criminal justice student organizations. Additionally, students have the option to enhance their degrees with an undergraduate certificate.
