\* We do not designate full and part time students: whereas it generally takes a full-time student 7 full semesters to complete the program, this is not a mandatory plan of study. Therefore, to account for both full and part time students, we use a 5 year bench-mark from start to completion.

\*\*Given that the University gathers aggregate data for the Counselor Education *Program* (which combines the Mental Health Counseling *track* and School Counseling *track*), this percentage is based on the completion rates for students in both tracks.

\*\*\* Based on 2011 scores, these pass rates represent those who passed the exam on their first attempt.

\*\*\*\* The National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC) provides the State of Florida with exam pass rate information. In 2011, 36 UCF alumni took the National Clinical Mental Health Counselors Exam (NCMHCE). As a comparison, for the entire state of Florida, the first time pass rate of all test-takers in 2011 was 61%.

\*\*\*\*\* The Association of Marital and Family Therapists Regulatory Boards (AMFTRB) does not provide the State of Florida with exam pass rate information, but the State Licensing Board was able to determine that 2 UCF alumni took the MFT exam in 2011. As a comparison, for the entire state of Florida, the first time pass rate of all test-takers in 2011 was 50%.

\*\*\*\*\*Students in the School Counseling track must pass their state qualifying exams during their internships and cannot graduate until they do so. Thus all students who graduate from the School Counseling track have passed their state qualifying exams.
