

COHPA Readmission Process

What to consider when seeking readmission support from the College of Health and Public Affairs following disqualification:

Readmission following disqualification into a major in the College of Health and Public Affairs is a very detailed process that requires a formal review of a student's academic readiness to return to a COHPA major. When seeking the college's support for readmission, students will be reviewed for educational readiness and completion of major specific requirements.

Students are **expected to demonstrate strong evidence of academic potential** (in coursework relevant to their chosen major) **and they must demonstrate resolution of all previous academic or personal issues that contributed to their disqualification.**

If you meet the criteria below, apply online in myUCF and submit the Readmission Packet to the College of Health and Public Affairs (COHPA) for review.

NOTE: Meeting the minimum criteria does not guarantee support from COHPA for readmission.

Before applying for readmission following disqualification, students should take a moment to review the following items which will be used in the College's review of their request:

- Students must first apply for readmission following disqualification in the [myUCF](#) system by published deadlines.
- Students are not eligible for readmission after being excluded from the University.
- Students must wait until two semesters have passed to begin the petition to return; COHPA will not support early readmission for students. During those two semesters students are expected to demonstrate positive academic progress.
- Students are **expected to have completed an Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree** from a Florida public institution if General Education Program and Gordon Rule requirements were not previously met prior to disqualification. COHPA strongly encourages every disqualified student to complete an A.A. degree.
- Students are expected to have **demonstrated positive academic progress**; positive progress is defined as A/B grades in college credit based courses taken at a Florida public institution after disqualification from UCF.
- Students seeking majors with prerequisite courses are **expected to have completed all program prerequisites** prior to seeking readmission.
- Students seeking readmission into majors that require a minimum GPA for graduation or for continuation in the major are **expected to have the minimum GPA** at the time they seek support from the college.
- Readmission support for **majors listed as "limited access" may not be granted**. Students looking at limited access majors (*Social Work, Athletic Training, Health Informatics, Health Sciences Preclinical Track, Criminal Justice Scholar's Track and Legal Studies Barry/Touro Law Track*) must contact COHPA Undergraduate Student Services to discuss their options (407) 823-0010 or hpainfo@ucf.edu
- **Support for readmission following disqualification is not automatic or guaranteed; therefore students are strongly encouraged to explore all possible alternatives to meet their educational goals.**
