Managing Healthcare Systems

Health services administrators are healthcare professionals who play an important role in managing public health systems, healthcare systems and hospital networks. They are typically responsible for budgeting, accounting, human resources, marketing and training. Healthcare administrators ensure that healthcare facilities and health systems are running smoothly so that the highest quality of healthcare can be delivered.

Health Services Administration at UCF

UCF offers a Bachelor of Science in Health Services Administration as well as a minor in health services administration. Courses are taught in a blended learning environment, with a mix of online and face-to-face components. In addition, the degree can also be completed fully online.

Curriculum

The B.S.HSA degree is designed to educate future health services administrators and healthcare managers on how to effectively plan, direct and coordinate the delivery of healthcare. The undergraduate program will also prepare students for an advanced degree in health services administration or other related disciplines.

The program's faculty members have expertise in health policy, healthcare leadership, international health systems and long-term quality care.

Career opportunities for health services administrators are diverse. While many work in a hospital setting, others are often employed by various types of healthcare facilities and organizations, including physician offices, nursing care facilities, home healthcare services and outpatient care centers.

Graduates also find positions in public health departments and other government offices. Others pursue careers in marketing, health insurance and selling health devices and pharmaceuticals.

Completion of a bachelor's degree can also prepare graduates for an advanced degree, which often increases opportunities for advancement in the field.
