Impact!

ORANGE — Evans High distributed 2,546 snacks, 837 supper meals and 157 parent resources in August-September 2016.

PASCO — Gulfside Elementary had 102 students attend its summer program.

ESCAMBIA — C.A. Weis Elementary is approaching 50 percent of its 500 students using the health cottage as their primary health care provider.

HILLSBOROUGH — Students attending Sulphur Springs K-8 YMCA afterschool program (60 percent of students) outperform students who do not.

Senior Pentagon Leaders Visit Endeavour Elementary in Cocoa

Senior officials from the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force toured Endeavour Elementary, Brevard County's first community school, during their visit to the Air Force Technical Applications Center on Sept. 7.

AFTAC has had a community partnership with Endeavor since May 2015. The center has provided mentors, increased excitement around the annual Math and Science Night, and taken students to the Science Bowl in Orlando, "bringing home the point that just because our students come from poverty doesn't mean they lack great minds," Endeavor Principal Rachad Wilson said.

The Air Force's senior official responsible for oversight of all programs affecting diversity integration and outreach, Jarris Taylor Jr., was impressed. "As I look around and see what's being accomplished here, I realize this is precisely the kind of program I want to see benchmarked throughout the Air Force," he said. "This partnership is something that needs to be replicated, and I hope my office can play a role in spreading the word about this enormous success story."

Did You Know?

- ◆ Community schools have collectively leveraged \$2.7M in local funding plus substantial in-kind contributions over the past year. This is in addition to the \$1.5M legislative appropriation received and beyond the 25 percent local match requirement for each school.
- ◆ Three directors have recently been hired to start community school planning activities in Leon, Indian River and Alachua counties! Four community schools are still emerging (Lake, Pinellas, Seminole, St. Johns).
- ◆ The central community school area at Evans High School is called the "Hub," at Edward T. White High it's the "Launch Pad," and at Howard Bishop Middle it's the "Nest."
