IDS CAPSTONE PROJECT: The final product will be a design studio experience for six (6) credit hours and covering two semesters. Students work in teams for the final product in the planning degree program under the supervision of a faculty advisor from their areas of concentration (Environmental Planning, Health & Human Services Planning or Transportation Planning). Students work closely with community partners and may work with the Institute for Economic Competitiveness, the Institute for Social and Behavioral Sciences, the Institute for Government, the Center for Public and Nonprofit Management, the Center for Community Partnerships, or the Metropolitan Center for Regional Studies in conducting community-based research or training projects. Part of the capstone experience is the presentation of the student’s work.
