Legislative Intern Experience



Last week, we sent you information on the Legislative Internship Program with the Florida House of Representatives, which is now accepting applications. Doctoral student Rebecca Entress completed this internship in 2011, as a student at FSU. Below is her experience with the program:

"In 2011 I interned at the Florida House of Representatives through the legislative internship program. The program places interns on a committee within the House, where the interns act as a policy analyst. As an intern, I had my own bills, for which I was the policy expert and served as the first point of reference for members of the Florida House of the Representatives. I wrote bill analyses, bill amendments, and end of session summaries for each of my bills.

My supervisors were supportive and a wealth of knowledge. They knew everything about state government and the legislative process and taught me more than I could have imagined. At the same time, they were exceptional supervisors, who provided honest and useful feedback on how well as I was performing, as well as ways in which I could improve. My supervisors are mentors who I still look up to today.


My experience at the Florida House of Representatives really shaped my professional career. Following the internship, I worked at the Legislature's Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA), before moving back to the house as a full-time analyst on the same committee in which I interned. I now work in government relations for Orlando Health, where I analyze health care policies that may affect the organization. I am still in close contacts with my coworkers at the House of Representatives and truly value the experiences and guidance that I have from the House.

If students are interested in the internship program I would encourage them to take advantage of any all opportunities at the internship. While the internship is only 20-30 hours per week, I often worked far more hours to be able to get a first-hand view on how bills and policies work through the process. I would also suggest that they apply to committees they are truly interested in. As an intern you spend hours figuring out complex laws and rules and working within a policy area that motivates gives you the push you need to get to the bottom of issues.

In sum, the internship at the Florida House of Representatives is a once in a lifetime opportunity to get a first-hand view of the policy making process. I strongly encourage any students to apply.




