What are your plans after graduation?

I'll be in a Transportation Analyst position at Kittelson & Associates (starting in May). I'm excited to take all the broad, contextual knowledge I've learned and apply it in a transportation firm. At the end of my career, I'd like to know that I contributed as much intellectual energy as I could to advancing the planning field as well as getting new generations of planners ready for issues they will face in a changing world.

Why did you choose the MSURP program?

I studied history as an undergraduate student where my main focus was on post-war building patterns that resulted in the urban and suburban environments we experience today. It was fun to research the cultural and technological motives that led to many citizens of large cities dispersing into outlying areas and purchasing land as part of a subdivision. I chose the MSURP program because it offered comprehensive knowledge of planning with the option of focusing in different areas.

What extracurricular activities or organizations are you involved in?

I'm the Treasurer for the Urban Knights, and I also work as a Graduate Funding Coordinator for UCF's College of Graduate Studies.
