



Legal Studies B.A./B.S.

The Legal Studies program provides students with a broad understanding of basic principles of law and the role and function of the legal system. In addition to preparing students for law-related careers, the program provides a foundation for law school or another graduate-level education. All the full-time Legal Studies faculty members are attorneys and available for law school advising. Satisfactory completion of the program requirements leads to the degree of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) or Bachelor of Science (B.S.) with a major in Legal Studies. Students pursuing the B.A. degree must demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to one year at college level.

Second B.A. or B. S.

A student who already has a B.A. or B.S. can obtain a second B.A. or B.S. in Legal Studies by completing a minimum of 30 new hours at UCF. The student must complete the seven required courses and at least 9 additional hours of Legal Studies electives.

Honors in the Major

An Honors in the Major program is available to well-qualified Legal Studies majors. Students in the honors program can conduct research in an area of their choice as well as prepare and defend a written thesis. The option provides serious students with an invaluable experience to better prepare them for graduate and law school and to provide them with the opportunity to enhance their credentials. To qualify for the honors program, a Legal Studies major must have a 3.2 UCF GPA in the major and a 3.2 overall GPA; have completed 60 hours of course work, including 12 credits of upper level credit hours; and have at least two semesters remaining before graduation. Upon completion of the program, the designation of "Graduation with Honors in Legal Studies" will appear on the student's diploma.

Specialization in Legal Studies

The Legal Studies program offers students the opportunity to earn a specialization within the program. All the specializations are appropriate background for students interested in attending law school or graduate school in related disciplines. They are also appropriate for the student who plans to enter the workplace with a Legal Studies degree. Students are not required to pursue a specialization.

Students may earn a specialization within the general program of study. Specialization requirements do not substitute for the Legal Studies degree requirements. However, with planning, specializations may be earned within the existing Legal Studies degree requirements.
