- PLA 6245 Advanced Applied Negotiation and Conflict Resolution:** Course provides students ability to understand the negotiation process and become stronger negotiators. Students delve into real-world conflict situations with an eye toward resolution.
- PLA 6246 Advanced Mediation and Conflict Resolution Practicum:** Places students in Community High School to enhance mediation and conflict resolution skills by engaging community to promote civil and professional discourse among all parties.
- PLA 6247 Conflict Resolution Theory:** This course is an exploration of various theories on conflict resolution and practice.
- PLA 6486 Administrative Law:** The study of administrative law and procedure on the federal, state and local levels.
- PLA 6515 Understanding Human Behavior and Conflict:** This course is an exploration of theories underpinning human behavior in conflict and the tools for navigating these behaviors in a variety of settings.
