

The Community School Model

Community schools are an evidence-based educational solution which addresses inequities in our most under-resourced communities. They focus on removing academic barriers by providing high-quality programs and vital services for students, to create conditions in which children learn and thrive.

Partnerships play a key role in community schools. Schools partner with community organizations to bring in local resources and services that address the needs of students and their families. These include medical and behavioral healthcare, food assistance, tutoring and mentoring, and opportunities for family and community engagement.

Community schools have a stabilizing effect, supporting student success, strengthening families and unifying communities.

Partnering for Success in Florida

Inspired by the promise of community schools leaders from the University of Central Florida (UCF) and Children's Home Society of Florida (CHS) partnered in 2009 to bring a community school model to Florida. Along with Orange County Public Schools and a healthcare provider, they brought the community school model to Evans High School in Orlando. Within one year, the graduation rates began to rise. In the decade that followed, graduation rates increased from 64% to a 98% — a remarkable 35 percent increase.

The Community Partnership Schools™ Model

The unique combination of partners supporting Evans — a university, nonprofit, school district and healthcare provider — and the partners' long-term commitment to the school led UCF and CHS to name the approach the Community Partnership Schools™ model of community schools.




Expansion and Milestones

2014 Plorida Legislature allocates **\$685,000** in funding to establish Community Partnership Schools and to launch the *UCF Center for Community Schools.*

2018 Florida Legislature allocates **\$1.4 million** in funding for 9 schools.

2019 Florida Legislature allocates **\$7.1 million** in funding for 10 schools, establishs the Community School Grant Program and **names the UCF Center for Community Schools** as the grant program administrator.



UCF Center Is a Leader

National and international community school leaders have taken note of the UCF Center for Community Schools' success in creating, supporting and certifying community schools in Florida. The center's advisory board includes national and international community school leaders.

Moreover, the London-based International
Centre for Excellence of
Community Schools named
the UCF center as its first
international hub in 2018.
The center is now offering
guidance to community
school efforts globally.

Recently, the center hosted site visits by educators representing British Council Wales and Duke University.

The UCF Center for Community Schools is poised to expand its capacity to create and advance the community school model in Florida and beyond.

Success Stories

- OCPS ACE \Rightarrow 71% decrease in discipline referrals from 2017-18 to 2018-19
- C. A. Weis Elementary School \Rightarrow out-of-school suspensions decreased from 425 in 2015-16 to 113 in 2017-18.
- Endeavour Elementary School teacher retention rate increased from 69% in 2016-17 to 94% in 2018-19.
